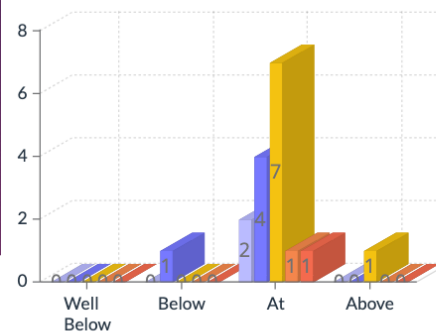

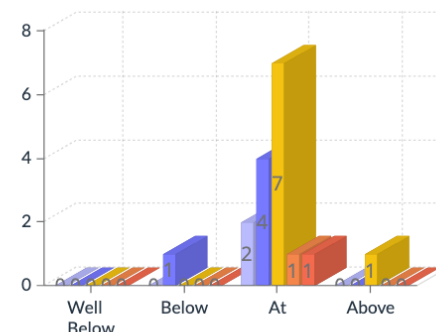

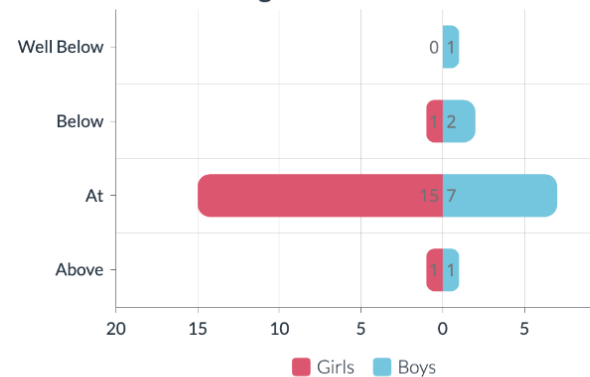

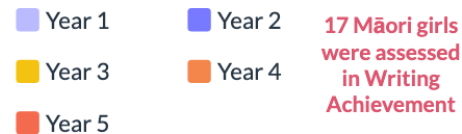

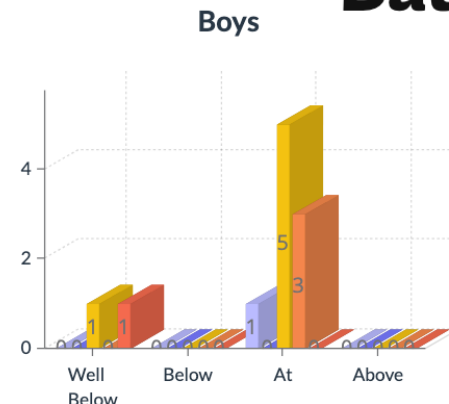

Māori Writing Achievement Data



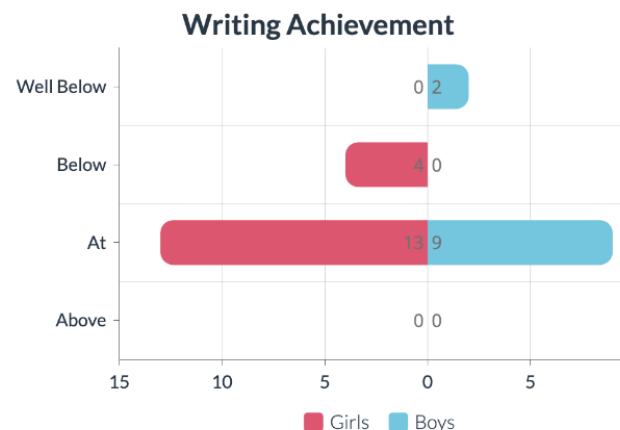
76% of Māori girls are performing at the expected level in Writing

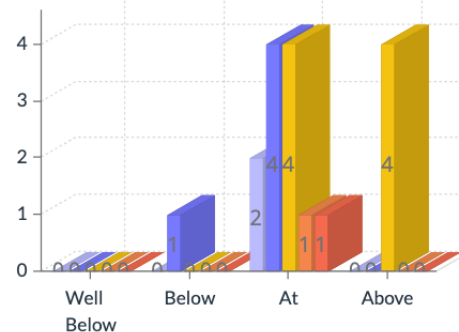

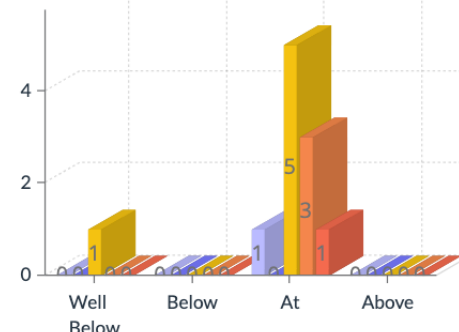

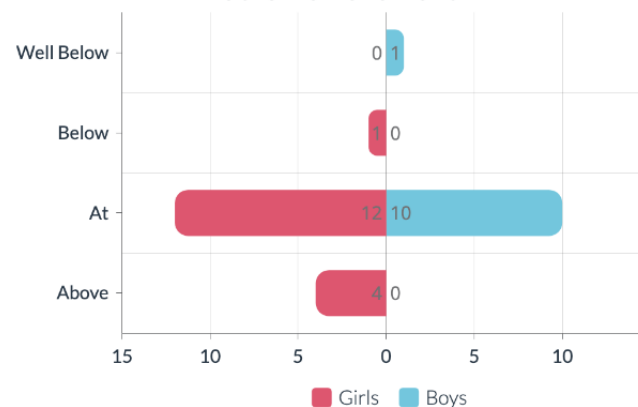
INSIGHTS
